

In Honor of Colonel William and Martha Bratton American Revolutionary War Patriots Sons of the American Revolution Grave Marking Ceremony

Colonel William and wife Martha Bratton were Revolutionary War patriots. Col. Bratton Commander of the Bratton Regiment led his Whig militia troops to victory against British Legion Dragoons under the command of Captain Christian Huck at the Battle of Williamson's Plantation or Huck's Defeat on July 12, 1780.

In fearless defiance Martha Bratton stood her ground and refused to provide information on her husband's whereabouts to British Capt. Huck even under threat of death. This Patriot victory revived morale of patriots through the Carolina back country and became a rallying point that set in motion the victories at Kings Mountain and Cowpens
